Junior and Senior Hand-Bell Choirs played at various times during the year and were specially featured at Christmas when the Junior Bells played with the orchestra and Adult Choir in presenting "BORN A KING" by John Peterson on December 20th. They played again at the Sunday School Christmas program on December 22nd. The Senior Bells played with the Campus Chorale in a Christmas Eve Carol Concert presented live on KHOF-TV. The young people went Christmas caroling to shut-ins afterward. On December 27th, the Christ's Ambassadors Drama Club gave a touching drama "ALL THE WAY", directed by John Cardoza, with music provided by the Campus Chorale under the direction of Tim Schoch.

To all the choir members of all groups who contributed their time and talent to the services; the orchestra members who faithfully played for the Sunday evening service; and the pianists, Erna Hughes, Lynn Cole and Phyllis Docken and our organist, Ruth Schoch - a sincere note of appreciation.
